Prepare Now for the 2012 Fishing Season

Usually April is the beginning of the spring fishing season. With the unusually warm weather we had in March, many folks have started fishing already. The beginning of the season is a good time to review your equipment. Check your rods for nicks in the guides. Replace any that are damaged. Check the reel seats and rod handles too. Any needed repairs can be made at your local bait shop. This is a good time to check your fishing reels too. Inspect your reels and clean and lubricate them. Remove the old line and spool up with fresh line. Again, your local tackle shop can help you with preparing your reels and spool up with fresh line.

If you are a boater, inspect your safety equipment now. Replace any damaged or expired equipment. Make sure all your life preservers are in good condition. Check your horn, your fire extinguishers, etc. Make sure your boating season is a safe one!
